Tremploy is a registered charity that supports adults with intellectual disabilities on Prince Edward Island by facilitating meaningful opportunities for work, and by assisting them to enrich their lives and reach their full potential. **Tremploy's philosophy is that every client has the right to be as productive and self-sufficient as possible and participate in a meaningful way within the community.**

Tremploy provides day programming, one-to-one support and employment assistance services to approximately 125 clients with intellectual disabilities each year in the Charlottetown area. Tremploy works closely with the Island business community through our Social Enterprise Program on wood production projects and various service and assembly contracts. In addition to working with clients with intellectual disabilities, Tremploy offers employment programming for individuals across the province who need support to transition or re-integrate into the PEI workforce.

Most recently, Tremploy launched an international work skills development program called Project Search at the Queen Elizabeth Hospital for young adults with intellectual disabilities.

New Facility Project: Building for the Future

In 2019, Tremploy examined numerous options and determined that a new facility is necessary to meet growing demand and need for a modern and accessible space. The existing facility at 75 Raider's Road is over 50 years old, and the building design is not conducive to meeting the increasing needs of our clients. The organization also needs to expand services to address the growing waitlist for services.

Tremploy will be receiving generous Federal and Provincial Government funding for a new facility under Infrastructure Canada's Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program. The new 24,000 square foot building located in the Bio Commons Business Park will meet Tremploy's current and future needs for clients, improve safety, accessibility and energy efficiency, and offer more services to our clients and business partners.

With the combined effects of the pandemic, inflation, supply chain issues and world events, the organization has encountered increased building costs for the new facility. The total cost of the project is approximately \$9.5 million. Between contributions from Tremploy's assets and the Federal and Provincial government funding, the organization has secured \$8.5 million of the overall project costs.

Tremploy is reaching out to the Island community for the first time in over 50 years to raise the remaining \$1 million to complete this important project. A successful Capital Campaign will allow Tremploy to continue directing operating funds towards service delivery for clients and their families.
